I made this series in May 2018 at Hartmannswillerkopf, in the traces and vestiges of this battlefield of the First World War. It is a work on memory and time. It was a century ago, but it is still a living story, our story. Close to us, the story of our families ...

My path of memory is the search for my great-grandfather who come from the Catalan country and fought in this sector in 1915. It is there, where they are all there, German and French soldiers, now united on this mountain "mangeuse d'hommes".

Time has passed and life has resumed in the remnants of trenches, shelters and barbed wire ... Now everything is calm and peaceful, but the paths are reminiscent of the suffering of these men and the mountain has become a sanctuary.
